

Ten Better Uses for Ten Percent of the Pentagon Budget Last updated: July 17

As part of the annual must-pass military spending and policy bill (the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2021, or "NDAA"), progressive lawmakers have put forward a proposal to cut the massive \$740 billion Pentagon budget by 10 percent.

With the Pentagon budget at historically high levels, and with additional increases under President Trump, a ten percent cut is an overdue correction to the bloated Pentagon budget.

While the Pentagon will spend <u>close to \$74 billion</u> on our endless wars this year, a 10% cut to the Pentagon (\$74 billion), could be reinvested in:

- 1. **Ending Homelessness:** House every one of the more than <u>half a million</u> homeless people in this country with money to spare.
- 2. **Infrastructure Jobs:** Create more than <u>one million good jobs</u> in cities like Flint, Michigan, building desperately needed new infrastructure.
- 3. **COVID testing:** Conduct <u>2 billion</u> additional COVID tests, compared to the <u>46 million</u> done so far that's 44 times as many tests, or enough to offer six free COVID tests to every person in the United States.
- 4. **Racial Equity in Schools:** Close the \$23 billion funding gap between majority-white and majority non-white school districts.
- 5. **Free College:** Fund free college educations for more than <u>2 million</u> low income students, or the poorest ten percent of current college students.
- 6. **Clean Energy:** Fund enough <u>renewable energy</u> to power almost <u>every household</u> in the US.
- 7. **Green Jobs:** Create <u>one million</u> well-paying clean energy jobs, enough to transition nearly every worker in the <u>traditional coal</u>, <u>oil</u>, <u>and gas sectors</u>
- 8. **Teachers:** Hire <u>900,000</u> new public elementary school teachers, adding about <u>nine new</u> teachers to every public elementary school in the country.
- 9. **COVID unemployment relief:** Purchase enough N95 face masks for all of the 55 million essential workers to use one a day for more than a year.
- 10. **Face Masks:** Purchase enough <u>N95 face masks</u> for all of the <u>55 million</u> essential workers to use one a day for more than a year.

A \$74 billion cut is a strong step toward better spending priorities, and could make a tremendous difference in other programs ranging from health care and education to job creation at a time when it is desperately needed.
